PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT

FOR THE ATTENTION OF ELIGIBLE SHAREHOLDERS/BENEFICIAL OWNERS OF EQUITY SHARES OF UNICHEM LABORATORIES LIMITED UNDER SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE BOARD OF INDIA (BUY BACK OF SECURITIES) REGULATIONS, 1998, AS AMENDED This Public Announcement (the "Public Announcement") is being made pursuant to the provisions of Regulations (1) of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Buy Back of Securities) Regulations, 1998 (the "Buyback Regulations") for the time being in force including any statutory modifications and amendments from time to time and contains the disclosures as specified in Part A of Schedule II to the Buyback Regulations.

OFFER FOR BUYBACK OF UP TO 2,06,00,000 (TWO CRORE SIX LAKHS ONLY) FULLY PAID-UP EQUITY SHARES OF FACE VALUE OF RS. 2/- EACH ("EQUITY SHARES") AT A PRICE OF RS. 430/- (RUPEES FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTY ONLY) PER FULLY PAID-UP EQUITY SHARE ON A PROPORTIONATE BASIS THROUGH THE TENDER OFFER ROUTE.

THE BUYBACK OFFER

- 1.1. The Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as the "Board", which expression includes the Buyback Committee constituted by the Board to exercise its powers) of Unichem Laboratories Limited ("Unichem Laboratories" or the "Company"), at its meeting held on January 8, 2018 ("Board Meeting") approved the proposal to buyback up to 2,06,00,000 (Two Crores Six Lakhs Only) Equity Shares (representing up to 22.65% of the paid-up Equity Share Capital of the Company), at a price of Rs. 430/- (Rupees Four Hundred and Thirty Only) per Equity Share (the "Buyback Price") up to an aggregate amount not exceeding Rs. 885,80,00,000/-(Rupees Eight Hundred Eighty Five Crores Eighty Lakhs only) ("Maximum Buyback Size"), (being equal to 24.26% of the total paid-up equity capital and free reserves of the Company as per latest audited standalone balance sheet as on December 31, 2017) from the shareholders ("Shareholders") of the Company on a proportionate basis through a tender offer route in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Companies Act") and, the Companies (Share Capital and Debentures) Rules, 2014 (the "Share Capital Rules"), the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (the "Management Rules") and in compliance with the Buyback Regulations ("Buyback" or "Buyback Offer"). The Company sought approval of its shareholders for the said Buyback by a special resolution through a postal ballot notice dated January 8, 2018. The Shareholders approved the Buyback of the Company's fully paid-up Equity Shares from the existing shareholders / beneficial owners, on a proportionate basis, through the tender offer process pursuant to Article 61 of the Articles of Association of the Company and in accordance with provisions of the Companies Act, the Share Capital Rules, the Management Rules and the Buyback Regulations, by way of a special resolution, through the postal ballot ("Postal Ballot"), the results of which we are announcing on February 9, 2018 ("Shareholders' Approval").
- 1.2. The Buyback Price per Equity Share and the Maximum Buyback Size do not include transaction costs including brokerage costs, advisors' fees, printing and dispatch expenses, securities transaction taxes, goods and service tax, and stamp duty. The Buyback is subject to receipt of approvals of statutory, regulatory or governmental authorities as may be required under applicable laws, including the Reserve Bank of India, the Securities and Exchange Board of India ("SEBI"), and the stock exchanges on which the Equity Shares are listed, namely, the National Stock Exchange of India Limited ("NSE"), the BSE Limited ("BSE") (together with NSE the "Stock Exchanges").
- The Buyback shall be undertaken on a proportionate basis from the Shareholders as of February 16, 2018 (the "Record Date") through the tender offer process prescribed under Regulation 4(1)(a) of the Buyback Regulations. Additionally, the Buyback shall be, subject to applicable laws, facilitated by tendering of Equity Shares by such Shareholders and settlement of the same, through the stock exchange mechanism as specified by SEBI in the circular bearing number CIR/ CFD/POLICYCELL/1/2015 dated April 13, 2015 as amended via SEBI circular CFD/DCR2/CIR/P/2016/131 dated December 9, 2016, including any further amendments thereof (the "SEBI Circular"). Please refer to Paragraph 9 of this Public Announcement below for further details regarding the Record Date and share entitlement for tender in the Buyback.
- In terms of the Buyback Regulations, under tender offer route, the promoters of the Company have the option to participate in the Buyback. In this regard, Dr. Prakash Mody, one of the promoters, has informed the Company vide his letter dated January 8, 2018 regarding his intention to participate in the Buyback. The extent of his participation in the Buyback has been detailed in Paragraph 6 of this Public Announcement.
- 1.5. The Buyback Price of Rs. 430/- (Rupees Four Hundred and Thirty Only) per Equity Share represents: (i) a premium of 39.74% and 40.14% over the volume weighted average price of the Equity Shares on the BSE and on the NSE respectively for 3 months preceding the date of intimation to the Stock Exchanges for the Board Meeting to consider the proposal of the Buyback; and (ii) a premium of 33.43% and 33.49% over the volume weighted average price of the Equity Shares on the BSE and on the NSE respectively for two weeks preceding the date of intimation to the Stock Exchanges for the Board Meeting to consider the proposal of the Buyback.
- The aggregate paid-up share capital and free reserves as at December 31, 2017 (as per the audited standalone financial statements available as on the date of the Board Meeting recommending the proposal of the Buyback) is Rs. 3,650.57 Crores. Under the provisions of the Companies Act, the funds deployed for the Buyback cannot exceed 25% of the total paid-up share capital and free reserves of the Company i.e. Rs. 912.64 Crores. The maximum amount proposed to be utilized for the Buyback, is Rs. 885,80,00,000 (Rupees Eight Hundred Eighty Five Crores Eighty Lakhs Only) being 24.26% of the standalone fully paid-up share capital and free reserves of the Company and 24.86% of the consolidated fully paid-up share capital and free reserves of the Company as at December 31, 2017 and is therefore within the limit of 25% prescribed under the Companies Act.
- Further, under the Companies Act, the number of equity shares that can be bought back in any financial year cannot exceed 25% of the total paid-up equity capital of the Company in that financial year. Accordingly, the maximum number of equity shares that can be bought back in the current financial year is 2,27,34,000 (Two Crores Twenty Seven Lakhs Thirty Four Thousand only) Equity Shares (calculated on the basis of the total paidup equity share capital of the Company as on December 31, 2017). Since the Company proposes to buy back up to 2,06,00,000 Equity Shares, the same is within the aforesaid 25% limit. The maximum number of shares proposed to be bought back by the Company represent 22.65% of the paid-up equity share capital of the Company.
- 1.8. Pursuant to the proposed Buyback and depending on the response to the Buyback, the voting rights of the promoters in the Company may increase or decrease from the existing shareholding of the total equity capital and voting rights of the Company. After the completion of the Buyback, the public shareholding of the Company shall not fall below the minimum level required as per Regulation 38 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended. Any change in voting rights of the promoters pursuant to completion of Buyback will not result in any change in control over the Company.

Buyback. NECESSITY AND BASIS FOR BUYBACK

The Board in its meeting held on January 8, 2018, considered all relevant factors, including the strategic and operational cash requirements in the medium term, present debt to equity ratio of the Company, the increase in accumulated free reserves, considered it appropriate to allocate a sum not exceeding Rs. 885,80,00,000 (Rupees Eight Hundred Eighty Five Crores Eighty Lakhs Only) for distributing to the Shareholders holding equity shares of the Company on the Record Date, through a Buyback

recommend Buyback at a price of Rs. 430/- (Rupees Four Hundred and Thirty Only) per equity share for an aggregate consideration of upto Rs. 885,80,00,000/- (Rupees Eight Hundred Eighty Five Crores Eighty Lakhs

In line with the above and with an objective of enhancing the shareholders returns, the Board decided to

The Buyback is being undertaken to return to the equity shareholders, in an expedient, effective and costefficient manner, surplus cash which is in excess of the Company's ordinary capital requirements and current investment plans. The Buyback is being undertaken for the following reasons:

- The Buyback will help the Company to return surplus cash to its Shareholders holding equity shares broadly in proportion to their shareholding, thereby, enhancing the overall return to Shareholders;
- The Buyback, which is being implemented through the Tender Offer route as prescribed under the Buyback Regulations, would involve allocating to the Small Shareholders the higher of a) number of shares entitled as per their holdings, or b) 15% of the number of shares to be bought back, reserved for the Small Shareholders. The Company believes that this reservation for Small Shareholders would benefit a large number of public shareholders, who would get classified as "Small Shareholder" as per Regulation 2(1)(la) of the Buyback Regulations;
- The Buyback is expected to improve return on equity and earnings per share by reduction in the equity base, thereby leading to long term increase in Shareholders' value;
- iv. The Buyback gives an option to Shareholders holding equity shares of the Company, who can choose to participate and get cash in lieu of Equity Shares to be accepted under the Buyback offer or they may choose not to participate and enjoy a resultant increase in their percentage shareholding in the Company, post the Buyback offer, without additional investment.

MAXIMUM AMOUNT REQUIRED UNDER THE BUYBACK

The maximum amount required for Buyback will not exceed Rs. 885,80,00,000 (Rupees Eight Hundred Eighty Five Crores Eighty Lakhs Only) excluding transaction costs viz. brokerage, advisors' fees, printing and dispatch expenses, applicable taxes such as securities transaction tax, GST, stamp duty and other incidental and related expenses being 24.26% of the standalone fully paid up share capital and free reserves which is less than 25% of the aggregate of the fully paid share capital and free reserves of the Company as on December 31, 2017.

The funds for the implementation of the proposed Buyback will be sourced out of the free reserves of the Company (including Securities Premium Account) or such other source may be permitted by the Buyback

The Company shall transfer from its free reserves a sum equal to the nominal value of the equity shares bought back through the Buyback to the Capital Redemption Reserve Account and details of such transfer shall be

disclosed in its subsequent audited standalone financial statements. The funds borrowed, if any, from banks and financial institutions will not be used for the Buyback.

MAXIMUM PRICE FOR BUYBACK OF THE EQUITY SHARES

The Equity Shares of the Company are proposed to be bought back at a price of Rs. 430/- (Rupees Four Hundred and Thirty Only). The Buyback Price has been arrived at after considering many factors, including, but not limited to, the trends in the volume weighted average prices of the equity shares of the company on the BSE and NSE i.e. the stock exchanges where the equity shares of the Company are listed, the net worth of the company, price earnings ratio and impact on other financial parameters and the possible impact of buyback on the earnings per share.

The Buyback Price represents:

- i) Premium of 39.74% and 40.14% over the volume weighted average market price of the equity shares on BSE and NSE, respectively, during the three months preceding the date of intimation to the Stock Exchanges for the board meeting to consider the proposal of the Buyback.
- ii) Premium of 33.43% and 33.49% over the volume weighted average market price of the equity shares on BSE and NSE, respectively, during two weeks preceding the date of intimation to the Stock Exchanges for the board meeting to consider the proposal of the Buyback. The Company confirms that as required under section 68(2)(d) of the Companies Act, the ratio of the aggregate

of secured and unsecured debts owed by the Company will be not more than twice the paid-up share capital and free reserves as on December 31, 2017 after the Buyback.

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF SHARES THAT THE COMPANY PROPOSES TO BUYBACK AND TIMELINES

- 10.4 The Company will request BSE to provide a separate acquisition window ("Acquisition Window") to facilitate placing of sell orders by Eligible Shareholders who wish to tender Equity Shares in the Buyback. BSE would be the designated stock exchange for the Buyback ("Designated Stock Exchange"). The details of the Acquisition Window will be specified by BSE from time to time.

तीन साल में कंपनियों ने समाजिक कार्यों पर खर्च किए 28 हजार करोड़ रुपए

कॉरपोरेट सामाजिक उत्तरदायित्व (सीएसआर) नियमों के प्रभावी होने के बाद करीब तीन सालों में कंपनियों ने सामाजिक कार्यों पर 28,000 करोड़ रुपए खर्च किए हैं। नए कंपनी अधिनियम-2013 के अनुसार


कंपनियों को अपने लाभ का एक निश्चित फीसद सीएसआर के तहत सामाजिक कार्यों पर खर्च करना अनिवार्य है। यह कानून एक अप्रैल 2014 से प्रभावी हुआ है। कॉरपोरेट मामलों के मंत्रालय द्वारा एकत्रित आधिकारिक आंकड़ों के विश्लेषण के अनुसार एक अप्रैल 2014 से 30 नवंबर 2017 के बीच सीएसआर गतिविधियों पर कंपनियों ने कुल 28,111.63 करोड़ रुपए खर्च किए हैं।

चालू वित्त वर्ष में 30 नवंबर तक कुल 4,719 करोड़ रुपए की राशि सीएसआर पर खर्च की गई। सीएसआर पर कुल 13,827.86 करोड़ रुपए की सबसे ज्यादा राशि वित्त वर्ष 2015-16 में खर्च की गई। एक अप्रैल 2014 से 30 नवंबर 2017 के बीच सीएसआर पर खर्च की गई कुल राशि का 70% यानी 19.948.86 करोड़ रुपए निजी कंपनियों ने खर्च किए हैं। सीएसआर नियमों के प्रभावी होने के पहले वर्ष 2014-15 में इस मद पर कुल व्यय 9,564.77 करोड़ रुपए था।

वैश्विक बिकवाली के बीच विदेशी पोर्टफोलियो निवेशकों (एफपीआई) ने बीते सप्ताह घरेलू शेयर बाजार से 3,838 करोड़ रुपए की निकासी की।

जनवरी महीने में एफपीआइ ने 13,780 करोड़ रुपए की निकासी की थी। फंड्सइंडिया डॉट कॉम में म्यूचुअल फंड शोध की प्रमुख विद्या बाला ने कहा कि वैश्विक बिकवाली के बीच राजकोषीय घाटे का लक्ष्य चूकना और दीर्घकालिक पूंजीगत लाभ पर कर लगाया जाना इसके लिए जिम्मेदार रहा है।

उन्होंने कहा, 'हमारा मानना है कि पिछले कुछ दिनों में एफपीआइ द्वारा की गई निकासी का कारण वैश्विक बिकवाली है। यह अमेरिका में रोजगार के मजबूत आंकड़ों के बाद फेडरल रिजर्व द्वारा ब्याज दर बढाने की आशंका के बीच हुआ है।' आंकड़ों के अनुसार, एफपीआइ ने पिछले सात दिनों में शेयरों से 3,838 करोड़ रुपए की निकासी की है जबकि ऋणपत्रों में उन्होंने करीब 4,600 करोड रुपए की लिवाली की है। ऋणपत्रों में लिवाली के बारे में बाला ने कहा. 'अमेरिकी बांड में अधिक आय होने के कारण एफपीआइ के लिए ऋणपत्रों में निवेश करना आकर्षक हुआ है।' उन्होंने कहा, पिछले कुछ दिनों में कच्चे तेल के भाव में नरमी तथा मुल्यांकन में गिरावट के कारण भारतीय बाजार कम खर्चीले हुए हैं।

प्रति क्विंटल पर बंद हुई।

मुताबिक, समीक्षाधीन अवधि में गोल्ड फंड प्रबंधन के तहत परिसंपत्ति (एयूएम) 15 फीसद से अधिक गिरकर 4,906 करोड़ रुपए रह गई, जो कि पिछले साल इसी अवधि में 5,670 करोड़ रुपए थी।

पिछले चार वित्त वर्षों से गोल्ड ईटीएफ में निवेशकों की ठंडी प्रतिक्रिया मिल रही है। निवेशकों ने गोल्ड ईटीएफ से 2016-17 में 775 करोड़, 2015-16 में 903 करोड़, 2014-15 में 1,475 करोड और 2013-14 में

2,293 करोड़ रुपए की निकासी की। एक तरफ जहां गोल्ड ईटीएफ में सस्ती का

रुख रहा, वहीं इक्विटी और इक्विटी लिंक्ड सेविंग स्कीम (ईएलएसएस) में निवेशकों का रुझान बढा। 2017-18 के पहले 10 महीने में निवेशकों ने इसमें 1.5 लाख करोड रुपए का निवेश किया, जिसमें से 15,000 करोड रुपये से अधिक का निवेश अकेले जनवरी महीने में किया गया। एम्फी के आंकडे के मृताबिक, जनवरी में 14 गोल्ड ईटीएफ से 110 करोड़ की निकासी की गई जबिक 2016-17 के इसी महीने में 35 करोड़ की निकासी हुई थी। दिसंबर में कुल 58 करोड़ की निकासी की गई।

टोरंटो का स्थान है जिसकी कुल संपत्ति 944 अरब डॉलर है। इसके बाद 912 अरब डॉलर की संपत्ति के साथ फ्रैंकफर्ट 14वें स्थान पर और 860 अरब डॉलर की संपत्ति के साथ पेरिस 15वें स्थान पर है।

11.1 Upon finalization of the basis of acceptance as per Buyback Regulations:

11.1.1 The settlement of trades shall be carried out in the manner similar to settlement of trades in the secondary
